Achievements

Your child has achieved so much over the course of the year and now it is time to reflect on what makes them proud. Ask your child to think about their proudest achievements not just in the classroom but out of it too. After discussing your child's accomplishments, ask them to choose one. Work together to design and create an achievement medal. Do this by cutting a piece of card into a circle or a star, painting it gold or sticking gold paper on it. Why not have a ceremony and present the medal to your child!



Saying Goodbye


Your child may be changing teachers and or classes this year. There may also be a change of friends within these classes. Although we are reassuring the children that they will still be spending lots of time together. Talk to your child about the friends they have made this year. Who is important to them and why? What are they going to miss about Year 2? Support your child to draw around their hand on paper and carefully cut it out. On the template, ask your child to draw or write a message to a friend or teacher. On each finger they could write a word to describe the qualities of that person.

Individual Qualities

Ask your child to think about what makes them special. What makes them different to other people? You could ask other family members to contribute to this too and record their answers. Following this, ask your child to record their individual qualities on a person template (see below). They may wish to do this by creating a collage using cut out pictures from a magazine or by drawing pictures to represent those qualities.



Goal Setting

Read or listen to the story '[Giraffes Can't Dance](#)' (click title). Talk about how Gerald the Giraffe showed determination trying to achieve his goal. Ask your child what they would like to achieve next year, e.g. 'to improve my handwriting' 'count in 3's' 'show more kindness to others'. Make a vision board. This can be done in whatever way you like.
