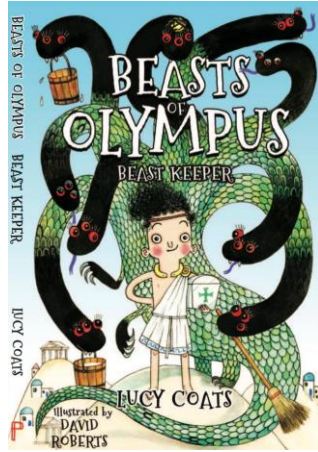

This series of books is recommended for any 7-9 year olds who enjoy books full of action and adventure. The Greek Mythology themed books are funny and magical.

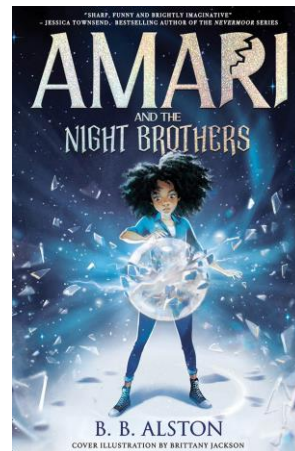


Amari and the night brothers- B. B. Alston
