This term, we will be beginning our Sex and Relationships lessons. We follow the Christopher Winter scheme of work which has been specifically developed to support the teaching of SRE to children and ensures that **all learning is age appropriate**. If your child is in a mixed age class, they will only be taught the content that is relevant for their chronological age group (e.g. Y3 and Y4 children who are in the same class, will be split up for this learning.)
